SPRINGBROOK

It is interesting to know how the towns of our county received their names. One in point is the small community of Springbrook. For a number of years prior to 1893 the community was called Hoskins in honor of Cyrus E. Hoskins a pioneer settler of the area. When a postoffice was to be established on June 30 1893 it was necessary to change the name as Oregon already had a town by the name of Hoskins in Benton County.

Mr. Hoskins a prominent horticulturist of the area called his farm "Springbrook" so that was the name chosen for the town.
