Our exhibit included

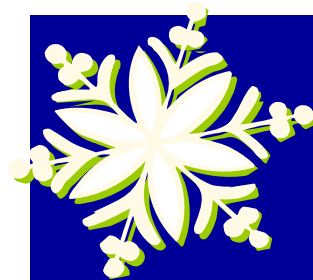

Going to be Temporarily Away???

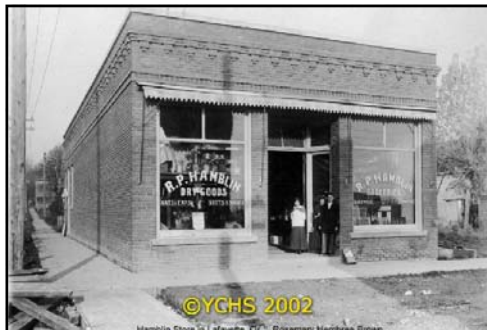

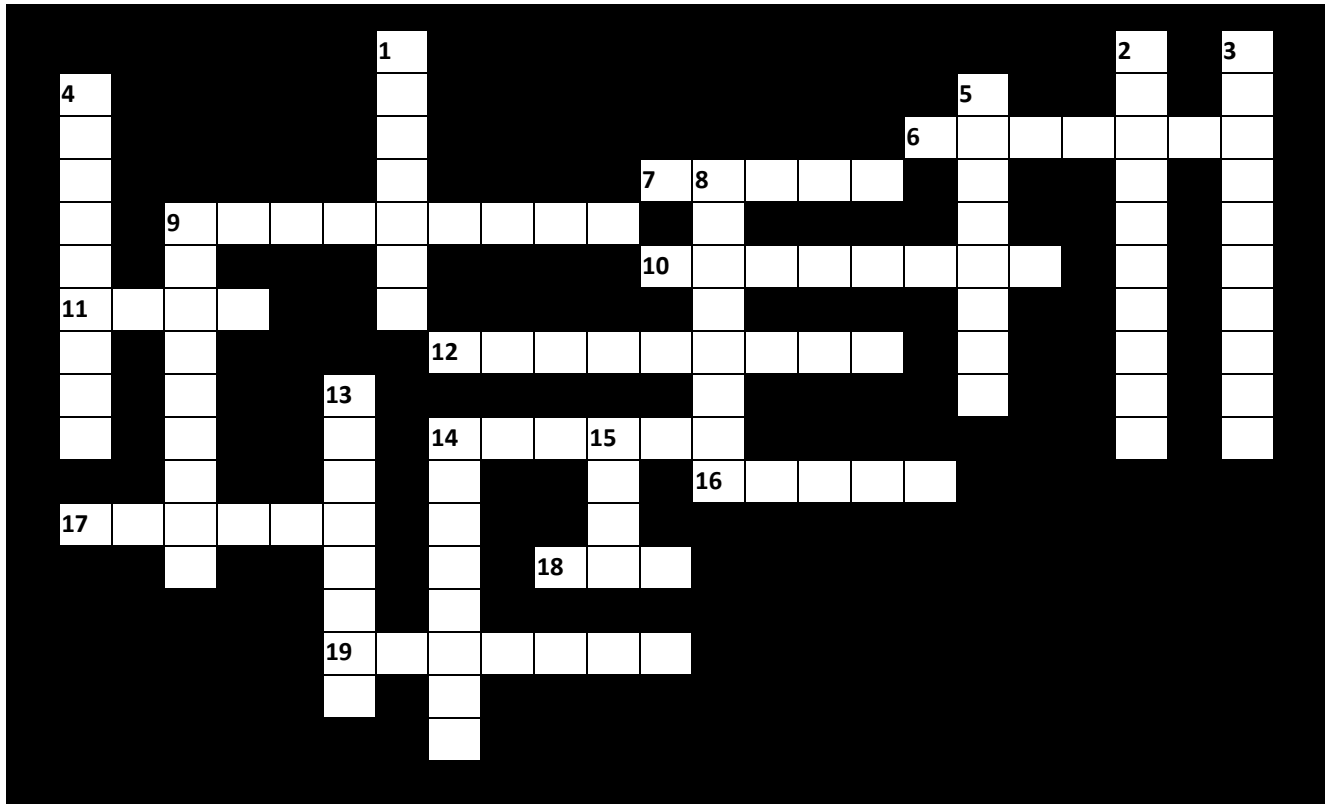

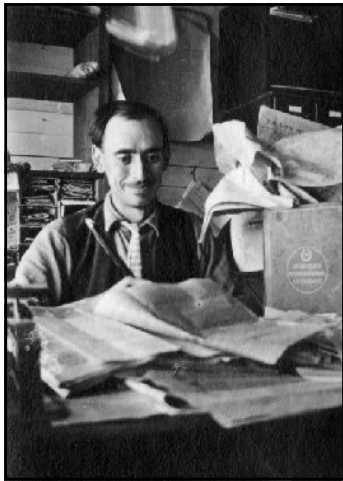

Margaret "Peggy" Roghair



For many years Peggy Roghair faithfully put out the YCHS newsletter which required a lot of patience with folks who were dilatory about getting contributions to her by the deadline. Her husband, Ed, helped by taking it to be copied, and Mike Boundy supplied the address labels. But Peggy edited, added to, and juggled to make all the information fit on both sides of the one-page typed letter. Her last issue was December, 1995. John White succeeded her.

The newsletter was a big job, but Peggy did many less noticeable things in support of the society. At the monthly meetings she made sure the dishes were uncovered, pies and cakes cut, and spoons put out. She checked to see that the food was arranged properly. If she and/or Ed volunteered for a job, they always followed through. When a school group came on the day of their 60th anniversary, Ed, showed classes the barn annex treasures, —and so did Peggy. Both were regular museum volunteers.

In the fall, they would bring apples to the potluck to share. Christmas saw lots of holly to decorate the tables and then give away. Peggy often provided décor for the tables, including the crooked-neck squash she dressed like people. Many people helped with refreshments at the Harvest Festival, but Peggy, dressed in a pioneer costume, and Betty Baltzell were masters at keeping the plates filled with beautifully arranged displays of cookies and other finger foods.

Once she delighted the members by singing a little Christmas song she learned as a child, and another time she quoted "Little Orphan Annie" for us.

Ed and Peggy were devoted to their church and were always involved in the garden section at the county fair. It was a sad day for the historical society when they moved to the Coos Bay area.

Peggy was a warm and loving friend.

Hutchcroft School Project



For several months you have seen an article regarding the Hutchcroft School that was written as we contemplated our ability to accept and move the schoolhouse to the Heritage Center. We accepted Mr. Raymond Whitlow's offer of the building to further our goal of the preservation and sharing of our heritage. We believed that the opportunity to preserve this schoolhouse at our Heritage Center would be a valuable first step in creating a Pioneer Village at the Heritage Center site. In that earlier article we solicited donations for Phase I of the project to move the building and stated that the anticipated budget was \$45,000.

You will recall that the Hutchcroft School is a one-room schoolhouse that was west of Yamhill and served as the school for District #15 from 1877 through the 1930s. It is one of the very few one-room school remaining in near-original condition in Yamhill County.

Thanks to your many donations, several of which were quite significant, and many from folks that have had ties with old one-room schoolhouses or education in the past, the Society has been able to proceed with Phase I. The schoolhouse was moved to the Heritage Center on October 21st and is in the process of having the roof reinstalled and made weather tight for the winter. Many thanks go to the Hutchcroft School Committee for making this happen. Particularly to Cliff Watts and John Lewis for managing the work. Our primary contractors have been Cliff Jensen from Yamhill and Northwest Structural Moving from Scappoose. Other local businesses have provided material and the Sawmill has cut much lumber for the reconstruction effort.

A dedication of the Hutchcroft School will be held during our Handmade Holidays Celebration in December.

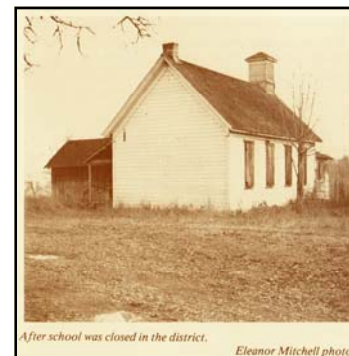
As we approach the completion of Phase I, which has come in under the original budget, at approximately \$35,000, we need to begin to address Phase II. It will include the restoration of the schoolhouse and will prepare it to support the Society's educational efforts. There are substantial additional costs for Phase II and fund raising will continue.
