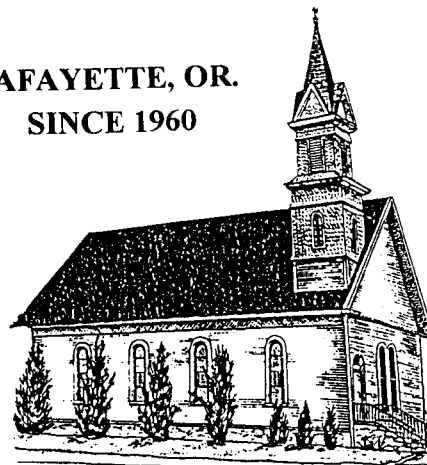

A video of this program was submitted to Reuban Contreras. It will be shown Tuesday, February 21 at 7:30pm, Wednesday, February 22 at 3:00pm and Friday, February 24 at 12:00 and 5:00pm on Cable Channel 9. The video will continue to be aired until further notice. Don't forget Jim's book, "Settling the Land of Promise", will be for sale for \$14.95 at the Museum. Jim and Rieta have generously agreed to donate 1/3 of each sale of the books at the Museum to the Society. Jim is also the new Historian for The Yamhill County Historical Society.

Saturday, March 4 is the date of the McMinnville Downtown Merchants Historic Tour. They will meet at the Cozine House at 10:00am and 2:00pm. Representatives of the YCHS will be present to greet those going on tour. They are Ken & Barbara Knutson and Jim & Rieta Lockett.

Because we have the Miller Log Cabin Museum with space for meetings, the Oregon State Historical Society has ask us to host one of their quarterly meetings on Monday, December 4th. We will provide coffee and donuts in the morning and catered lunch at noon. They expect 50 to 60 people. I feel this is quite an honor to be ask to host such an event.

Work continues at the museum site: Gutters and downspouts for the barn, the retainer wall by the log building, the handicapped driveway, and solutions for the drainage problems. Again we thank George Williams for his continued effort with all of this.

A revision of the by-laws is about finished thanks to Miriam Blair and Maxine Williams.

COMMITTEES:

The Braided-Crocheted Rug Committee: Headed by Maxine Williams is requesting donations of rags for the rug for the log museum project. Marrietta Rankin has agreed to instruct us in how to make and assemble. Heavy fabric should be in 1 3/4 inch strips for braiding and lighter weight fabric 1 1/2 inch for crocheting. If you do not wish to make them into strips we would still like the rags. Our first work day is March 18, 1-4 at the Miller Log Cabin. The second day is April 1, 1-4 at the same location. Bring rags, scissors, ruler, needle and thread. This is open to everyone, society, community, friends and relatives. Bring a guest. We hope this will become not only something for our own use but also a teaching activity and perhaps a fund raiser for the society. Your participation is needed.

The Oral History Committee: Headed by Ilene Lewis and Ilene Crowley. Donations or the loan of tape recorders are badly needed. We have two for society use, but that is not nearly enough. A script, release forms and blank tapes are available from either Ilene or myself. Have your list of names of those who should be interviewed to be turned in at the next meeting or call me. This has to be a full society project or we will never get to all the people we need to reach.
