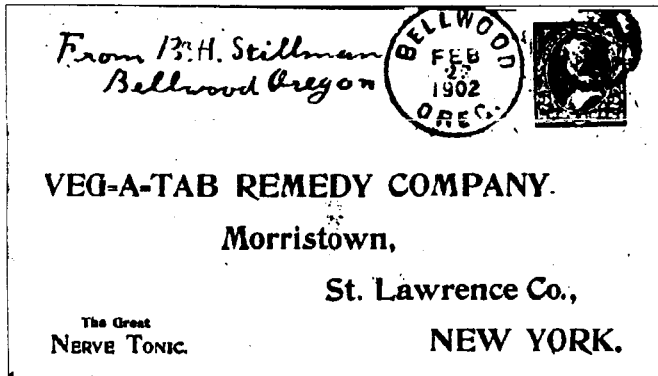

POST OFFICE SITE QUIZ
Test Your Knowledge of Yamhill County History

Since January 1850 when "Yamhill Falls" (now Lafayette) became the first U.S. post office to be established within the county, 48 more at various times were set up. The total number in service at any one time reached a peak of 24 at the turn of the century before rural delivery routes began to replace the smaller, less efficient or more remote offices. Shown below are the names of 14 Yamhill County communities from a bygone era and at the right is a scrambled list of their respective locations. The challenge is to match each office with its proper site. As an example (and to make sure everyone gets at least one correct), "LARCH" matches up with "(H) 13½ miles west from the town of Yamhill on the old Trask Toll Road".

Locations

- (A) At the present day intersection of Niederberger Road and Highway 99W.
- (B) Up Panther Creek about 7 miles west of Carlton.
- (C) At the residence of Moses Morgan in Happy Valley.
- (D) In the extreme southwest corner of the county on the old Grand Ronde to Hebo stage road.
- (E) Where today's Riverwood Road crosses the railroad tracks.
- (F) By the old Mountain Top School on Bald Peak
- (G) Along the Lafayette-Hopewell Road just south of its intersection with Fairview Road.
- (H) 13½ miles west from the town of Yamhill on the old Trask Toll Road.
- (I) In the lower Gopher Valley near the point where Dupee and Deer Creeks come together.
- (J) Almost exactly where the town of Wilsonville stands today.
- (K) On the Carlton & Coast Railroad not far from where the Flying M Ranch is today.
- (L) Never had a post office (trick question).
- (M) At junction of Woodland Loop Road with Highway 240.
- (N) Name later changed to "Rex".

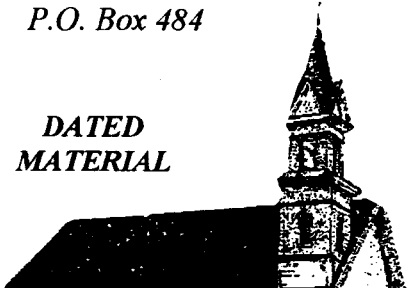
